BRINGING HEALTH SERVICES TO THE RURAL POPULATION OF TELUPID

" Program Hidup Sihat Bersama Komuniti"

On 28 September 2024, the Family Medicine Department and Radiology Department of Hospital Universiti Malaysia Sabah (HUMS) successfully organized the "Program Sihat Bersama Komuniti" at Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Telupid, Sabah. This significant event, which aimed to improve healthcare access and awareness in rural communities, was generously sponsored by the Pusat Uberisasi Kesihatan Komuniti, Hospital Universiti Malaysia Sabah.

Collaborative Effort

The organizing committee was a collaborative effort involving not only staff from HUMS but also representatives from SMK Telupid, the Panel Penasihat Klinik Kesihatan Telupid, and Klinik Kesihatan Telupid. Their combined efforts made this event a success and a much-needed initiative for the rural areas of Telupid, Tongod, and Beluran.



Key Highlights of the Event

The program was centered around offering vital health services, particularly to marginalized women from rural areas. One of the major activities was the donation and insertion of contraceptive implants for 48 women, helping to provide effective family planning solutions in areas with limited access to healthcare. Additionally, a total of 40 attendees received ultrasound scans, conducted by skilled radiologists from HUMS, Hospital Sandakan, and Hospital Tawau.

- Sex Education for Students
- Stroke and Heart Disease Prevention
- Introduction to Ultrasound
- Breast Cancer Awareness

- 1. Empowering Marginalized Women: By providing contraceptive implants, the event aimed to improve access to family planning for women in rural areas.
- 2. Improving Access to Ultrasound Services: The availability of ultrasound scans, a crucial diagnostic tool, brought muchneeded medical care closer to these underserved populations.
- 3. Raising Awareness on Preventive Care:
 Sex education, educational sessions on stroke, heart disease, introduction of ultrasound and breast cancer were designed to increase knowledge about early prevention, which can save lives in the long run.
